


Sunday March 30th Fourth Sunday in Lent (Rite I) Morning Prayer



Stations of the Cross

Grace Church has had a long tradition of praying the Stations of the Cross during Lent. A group of us gather together at 6:30 pm each Friday during Lent to follow the path that Jesus walked from his Condemnation by Pontus Pilate to the cross on Calvary to the Tomb. It is a simple service of prayers, readings and music which allows us to walk with Jesus during his final hours. The leader and torches move around the church stopping at each of the reliefs which hang on the walls of the nave. These depict the 14 "stations" or stops on Jesus' journey.

Please consider joining us at 6:30 pm for this very simple but moving service on one or more of the Fridays during Lent: 3/7, 3/14, 3/21, 3/28, 4/4 and 4/11. If you have any questions, speak to Father Victor or Claire Newquist. ~Claire

TRICKY TRAY 2025:

"I know that the Tricky Tray is coming up and I want to help, but I don't know how. What can I do?" Have you thought this or said it to a friend? If yes, here are some ways that you can help.

*Take a flier and post it somewhere, share it with your friends or post it on Facebook. Contact Mark if you need him to email it to you.

*Ask a local vendor for a gift card; or a buy a gift card yourself to use in lieu of a basket. Popular gift cards are from Home Goods, Amazon, Starbucks, Dunkin' Donuts, any fast food restaurant, etc.

*If you see large baskets or bins, buy one or two; we always need these.

*Buy some items to go into a basket. There is a list of basket suggestions at church or we can email you a list.

*Make a monetary donation toward a basket or special prize.

*Let Anne know if you can take a road sign. They will be available after church on April 6th.

*Donate new items to be used as door prizes—some ideas are candles, gift cards in small denominations (\$5), mugs, stationary, inexpensive kids toys.

*Do you have something at home that you bought but can't remember why you bought it and haven't used, donate it to be used in lieu of a basket. Last year someone donated an unused aquarium. Remember the item must be new and, if possible, in its original packaging.
