


Construction Project Next Door

For all my time here at Grace, the building next door was vacant and was just that to me, the empty building next door. But many of you remember our vacant neighbor as the Montgomery Ward Building. Well, work has begun in earnest this year to "repurpose" the former Montgomery Ward from a commercial building to a residential building. The new owners intend to keep the historic North Street façade and entrance. The original North Street upper floor windows will be removed, rebuilt and reinstalled.

The street level will be for retail stores and the upper floors for residential apartments. There will be a mix of 1 and 2 bedroom units. The conversion to residential use requires several modifications, including the addition of windows for the new 23 apartments being built. The wall facing our churchyard will need to have windows installed in it. An elevator is also being installed for movement from the first floor to the top floor.

The window installation requires the owner to access our churchyard to measure, install

and seal the walls around the new windows. We have worked out an agreement with our neighbors to cover their use of our churchyard to complete their window renovations.

Workers have framed protective covers over our stained-glass windows and will soon assemble scaffolding. We anticipate the scaffolding, once erected, will remain in place until all the window installation work is completed. In the future, I hope to write about the progress of the work at various stages of its completion. ~Joe.








Vestry News
