



#### A Job Well Done



As she gets ready for her last day of work on Monday, June 30th, we want to take a moment to recognize Phyllis Guardino for her 20 years of dedicated service to Grace Church and the Guild of St Margaret. Phyllis accepted the position of Parish Secretary in 2005 and immediately set out to organize the day-to-day operation of the Parish Office and set up a comprehensive accounting system. Over the years, Phyllis' responsibilities increased as she became Parish Administrator. In 2012, Phyllis also became the Director of the Guild of St Margaret, helping to keep the program operating at a time when we had lost one of our major grants. Since becoming full time Director of the Guild, Phyllis has expanded both its programs and our funding sources and helped to increase our visibility both in the community and throughout the Diocese. Her creativity and ability to "think outside the box" (or in this case the building), helped us to keep the Soup Kitchen open and serving our guests during the COVID-19 pandemic. She was even able to expand services, adding a food pantry program.

In the years since the end of the pandemic, she has worked to solidify the Soup Kitchen program's staffing and services, opened a Food Pantry program that allows recipients to choose their own groceries, expanded our grants and donations and become a valued member of the Episcopal Charities Board. As she does all this, she still finds time to help us keep the Parish Office running. She is always willing to put her own work aside to answer questions, help us figure out how to make Church Windows work, or to find some document or address some immediate need. This often means that she then stays late to get her own work done or takes work home to do on her own time.

Phyllis, we will miss your smiling face in the office each day but know that you will always be a phone call away if we need your help—as long as we don't interfere with your time with your new granddaughter.


