Dear Grace Church members,

Most of you already know I came out at church as transgendered the last Sunday of June, not coincidentally during Pride Weekend. I was overwhelmed by the acceptance and love I felt from everyone and I thank you all. You make me proud to be an Episcopalian and a member of Grace Church.

So how does this affect our relationship? First and foremost, I am the same person you've known for years, you just know me better now. It seems the most confusing thing for people is how to address a trans person. The guideline I've learned is to address a trans person by the way they are presenting. I'm not overly sensitive on that point (but I know other trans folk who are), but the pronouns she and her are appropriate when I'm in drag (a stage direction for dress as girl). My chosen female name is Deandra, or Dee for short. When in drab (dress as boy), the usual he or him works, and I've become accustomed to David as my masculine name, so that works best. However, I'm not offended as a rule if my gender gets confused. I'm confused too.

Going forward, you will see me in church as either David or Deandra. I am comfortable in both personae, but I need to be sensitive to the environment and people I'll be around. As such, my decision will be affected by what we are doing after church more than anything.

I hope this answers a few questions, but I am happy to answer others you may have.


Vestry News
