#### Who Made Our Beautiful Kneelers?

Probably close to 40 years ago, a young woman whose name I've forgotten began attending services at Grace. She stood out in that she had a profound faith that her disabled little boy would become well. She was slight, but she carried him with strong arms up to the Altar to be blessed each week, a very touching sight.

She was also a gifted artist and soon she was involved with a group of Grace parishioners who did needlework. It was she who personally designed our beautiful kneelers, placing the designs on the canvas for the people who would do the needlepoint, indicating what colors were to be used and helping with the work.

The group set to work. I am positive of some of the names, but unsure of others, but these were probably the folks who took part in the needlework: Mary Carpenter, John Cook, Nell Cook, Joyce Graziano Weissert, Edith Marquez, Pat Marquez, Norma Osgood, Lyn Pierce and Kaye Thacker. I think Mary Caskey was involved as well.

The group worked both together and separately, slowly making their way through all of the intricate designs and the never-ending blue background. Eventually, they finished and the kneelers were sewn and finished professionally. It was a happy day when they were installed and blessed, replacing the old, faded and worn (I believe they were red) kneelers, and today they still look as good as new.

The group went on to begin the creation of smaller kneelers for the Acolytes. Some sort of rift occurred then, also the artist left Grace, and the work ended unfinished. I always wondered what happened to the unfinished pieces.

Recently, Carolanne Cusack, Director of the Guild of St. Margaret, found two pieces of partly finished needlepoint as she was cleaning out the office. I was able to help with identifying what they were, but questions still remain: Does anyone remember the name of the young woman who designed and worked on the kneelers? Does anyone know if there are any more unfinished pieces? Have I left anyone out of the list of those who worked on the kneelers? And, finally, is there anyone who would like to finish the found pieces?



#### Cathedral to Host Funeral Service for Dr. Jane Goodall, DBE

WASHINGTON – Washington National Cathedral will host the funeral service for world-renowned ethologist and conservationist Dr. Jane Goodall, DBE, on November 12, 2025, at 11:00 am. Dr. Goodall's life and work made an indelible mark on our understanding of humankind and the environments we all share.

Initially recognized for her groundbreaking work with chimpanzees, Dr. Goodall's observation of tool-use in non-human animals is known as the moment that "redefined humankind." This finding was followed by many others during her research of wild chimpanzees, including the existence of strong mother-infant bonds, meat-eating and hunting, primitive warfare, altruism, and compassion. Dr. Goodall's findings influenced fields of human health, evolution, and ecology.


